Finally, increasing awareness of side effects in pediatric patients and methods to reduce these effects will be addressed.

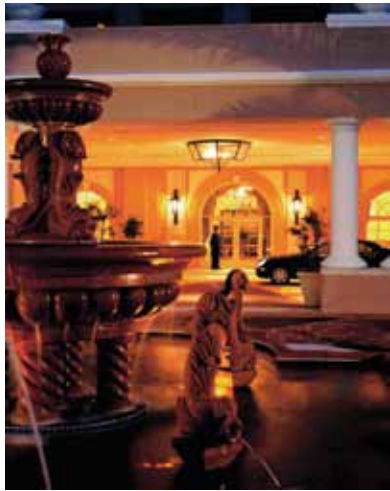
